Dear Dottie:

What a surprise to learn that you too are a Turnbull-Bacon combination! In all my chasings of Turnbuls and Bacons you're the only other one I've come across.

I think the enclosed sheet pretty much tells what I know about my Bacon line. As you can see, my Benjamin Bacon was in America at least by ca 1800 and probably long before, so its not likely there's a direct connection between my Bacons and yours in Ireland. Mine seem to be related in some way (though I've not yet managed to track it down) to two early New England settlers, Michael Bacon of Dedham, Mass. and Asa Bacon of Wrentham, Mass. There are a good many given names in common and my Bacons turn up in close proximity to descendants of these lines both in the U.S. and Canada every so often. You're right about the roving nature; I don't think my Bacons ever stayed in the same place for two census enumerations in a row and I've often felt they must have been gypsies. There are so many of them too - until I got into this I would never have thought there were so many Bacons.

Went through my "Other Bacons" file and found a couple of Irishmen. William Bacon & wife Rebecca came from Dublin and died in Mass. in 1653. Daniel Bacon of Woburn, Mass. was said by tradition to have come from Ireland. No help to you of course.

I'll keep your Bacon connection among my Turnbuls and Bacons so if anybody turns out who seems to relate to either of your lines I can aim them in your direction. The card index file sounds like a just great idea and I have great hopes for its making some connections between our various Turnbuls. What a lot of work it will be - I do admire you! Wish I were closer to you as I'd love to work on it.

If my Bacons do belong to the early New England lines they are from England, Suffolk & Norfolk. However there's really no tradition among my Bacons as to where their forebearers came from so they could turn out to be Irish yet. One story says they came from Holland as religious dissenters so William Bacon (above) is of interest because he was a Quaker. However I have no confirmation of the Holland story and I've refuted a lot of Bacon stories in my line so I don't put much faith in that one.

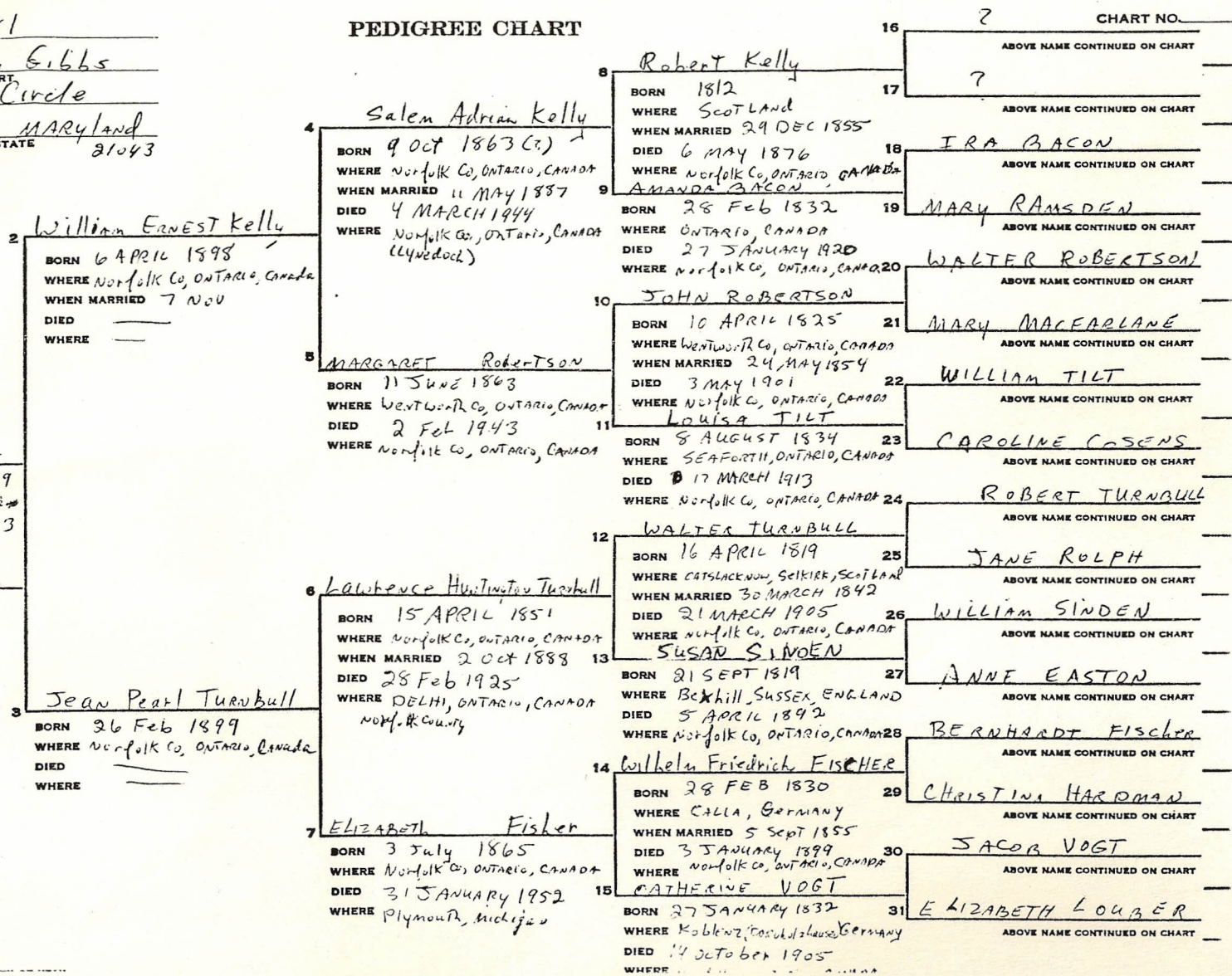
